APRIL 2025: WHAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES IS WORKING ON

- 1.Gale Braunstein, Senior VP at Taylor Management, attended our meeting. She educated the board on the various services that they can provide to our community.
- 2. We spent \$50,450 on snow and ice removal this year. Our policy is that if this bill is over \$50,000, we do an assessment to recover the excess expense. The board made an exception and will not do an assessment. We will cover the excess cost. This is a one-time exception due to the other assessments recently for the roof and siding projects.



- 3. The board voted to purchase an automated testing and chemical additions system for approximately \$8,200. This is for the pool only. We are investigating the Spa costs and are looking to combine both systems into one. This should help us eliminate the Monitors and reduce our pool costs for the foreseeable future.
- 4. We have approved of the quote to get the clubhouse carpets cleaned.
- 5. We are working with the landscape committee to get new bushes planted around the utility boxes on Young Court. Robin Morley has guided us as to the appropriate new bushes and the location where they will be planted. Tara is working on getting the existing stumps removed.
- 6. We are investigating the purchase of an electric fireplace insert for the clubhouse main floor. This would create a very nice ambiance to the clubhouse while eliminating the risk of fire and eliminating carbon monoxide issues with the existing unvented gas fireplace.
- 7. Geese have become quite an issue, BUT **WE WILL NOT KILL THE GEESE**. Roger Off, who lives by the pond, has told us the geese leave in Mid-March and return on mid-October. We have decided to tackle this issue in late September. Bob has donated two coyote decoys which we will place near the pond. We will also install small pink flags around the pond, thanks to Kathy Moke's investigation. They have been observed as working very well. These are at a cost of \$25 for 200 flags. We will try these as an inexpensive test.
- 8. We have scheduled a budget meeting with Taylor on 5/5. Each board member will create a budget for their area of responsibility. We will then work with Talyor as to what the budget should be and what the new HOA fee will be, starting in July 2025.
- 9. The Finance Committee and board are working with Falcon Engineering to create a new Engineering Study. This will guide us as to new reserve requirements determined by the new NJ Law on Reserve Balances. This will be a part of the new HOA fee calculation.

Alert Chester is a notification system that is being used to transmit information and alerts to Chester Township residents. One of the initiatives was to be able to better communicate in real time and this system allows us to do just that. This system communicates via the method of your choosing. You can select text, phone call, or emails when you sign up via the link below. The Chester Police Department, Chester Township DPW, and Chester OEM will provide real time notices for things such as road closures, road paving, and police actions that need to be shared. You can also expect to receive other notices such as holiday garbage pick-up changes. Our residents can sign up one of two ways:
