What The Board Is Working On In August

- We are preparing for the Open Meeting on September 18 (Revised Date) at 7PM in the clubhouse. We will be reviewing the 2024/25 year-end financial results and our plans for the new year.
- We will inspect all driveways with our vendor to determine the ones that need to be patched and the ones that need to be replaced. We think we have the money to replace four or five of them.
- We will be finalizing the year end financials and providing our auditor with the appropriate information. We hope to get the draft audit in September
- The board is in the process of updating the Rules and Regulations (Orange Book). This is an arduous process as we need to comply with our Bylaws and include all the resolutions from the past eight years. Once we are done, we will get the review committee together to make recommendations.
- The pool automatic tester and chemical adder are installed in the pool and working. We are waiting for the spa to be completed next and the change to no monitors
- Signed contract with Cedarwood Landscaping Inc. to repair the paths around the pond and between Drake and Wyckoff.
- We are inspecting the sidewalks and stoops for need of repair or replacement. We are collaborating with a contractor for suggestions and pricing.
- Jan Fence will be replacing 140 top caps made of synthetic material
- · Continuing to monitor the work of ZD Stucco on the building refresh project.
- We are working with the Water Committee to get the development hooked up to the Mendham town water. We have a commitment to get that completed by 9/30/26. Stay tuned!
- We are working with the town to get our street signs replaced or cleaned.
- · We are working with Cedarwood to do final planning for the berm reductions needed

How We Are Trying Top Reduce The Geese Droppings On The Pond Path AND SURROUNDING AREAS

Between 3.5 and 5.5 million non-migratory Giant Canada geese reside in the US and lower Canada. They are joined by an additional 9 to 11 million migrant Canadian geese from northern Canada each fall to late spring. This population is growing exponentially at the rate of 30% each year, and the resulting mess they create (at least a pound of droppings per day per goose!) is both unsightly and unhealthy. Moreover, it increases the fecal coliform levels in ponds and can contaminate adjacent water and ground.



Therefore, we are attempting to limit the geese activity in our development. We are trying a twostep approach. We are installing two coyote replicas near the pond. One will be stationery, and the other one is on a post so it will move and flutter in the wind. The other is solid and looks like a statue. We will move them from time to time to keep them effective at scaring the geese.

Above is the picture of both of them. They are not real, and they are harmless to humans.

At the same time, we are installing 100 small pink flags around the pond. Other properties have tried these with enormous success and we are hoping to have satisfactory results too. They are cheap, \$15 for 100 of them, so we have insignificant risk.

Neither of these deterrents harm the geese. Look for them near the pond.

THE NEW FIREPLACE IS INSTALLED IN THE CLUBHOUSE

After many years with an unusable fireplace (because it was not vented outside) we have installed an electric one with a space heater included. Anyone can use this fireplace if you would like some ambiance in the clubhouse. You will find the remote and instructions on the right side of the fireplace in a white remote holder.



Here are the rules which must be followed:

- 1. The light switch behind you on the wall (to the right) must be on.
- 2. Start the fire by using the remote (see the directions for the remote in the remote holder on the right side of the fireplace).
- 3. Please return the remote to the holder, when done, so it does not get lost
- 4. When leaving the clubhouse, turn off the fire with the remote then shut off the wall switch
- 5. Enjoy the ambiance!!

LEAD PIPE ISSUE

Editor Note: This article is to help clarify the August 6, 2025 mailing from New Jersey American Water

1. Legal Background & New Jersey Requirements

- In New Jersey, lead service lines were effectively banned from 1986 onwards. Post-1986, any "lead-free" plumbing fixtures and solder were limited in lead content and had to comply with stricter standards—less than 0.25% lead content, as per regulations updated decades ago.
- In July 2021, New Jersey passed legislation requiring utilities to identify and replace all lead and galvanized service lines by 2031. Utilities must now notify homeowners if service lines are made of lead, galvanized steel, or are unknown.
- New Jersey American Water (common supplier in your area) notes that while water mains are not lead, the service line from the street to your home (and the building's internal plumbing) could be lead if older—but in newer construction such as your 2020-built complex, that's far less likely.

2. Reasonable Inference for New Construction

A housing complex built in 2020 would be subject to all current plumbing codes—meaning:

- Lead piping was already banned well before that date.
- Plumbing would very likely use materials such as copper, plastic (e.g., PEX), or PVC, all of which are compliant with the "lead-free" requirements in both federal and state law.
- Lead solder and fittings are heavily regulated; using them in new construction would violate code
