### HOW TO CREATE A MAINTENANCE WORK REQUEST ON TAYLOR NOW

One of the upcoming changes announced in the September 1, 2022 communication to all Owners is that the "Maintenance Request" process will be going online.

Below is the procedure provided for Owners to register and use the Neighbor (NBR) online system.

- 1) On your browser go to WWW.FSAC.NBRNETWORK.COM
- 2) Sign in or press "need to register" if you do not have a TaylorNow login.
- 3) Navigate to "For Residents" and then "Online Forms".
- 4) Next Press "Maintenance Request Form".
- 5) Fill in the appropriate information and press Submit.

Your maintenance request will now go directly into Clare and Patrick's queue to be processed.



Followed by the film: A Night To Remember (about 2 1/2 hours)


